**Devotions for Easter: Week 4**

**O God, our shepherd, our gate, our lamb:**

**In the resurrection of Your Son you have brought us into Your pasture.**

**Guide us to Your clear streams, and tame the wolf at our gate through Christ our Lord, Amen. Alleluia.**

**Scripture:**

**John 10:11 – I am the Good Shepherd. The Good Shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.**

**John 10:9 –10 - I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. They will come in and go out and find pasture...I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full (life in all its fullness.)**

**The prayer for this week takes us into the richness of the blessings of Psalm 23:**

**Green pastures, still waters, restored (enriched) life.**

**And the words of Jesus to us in John 10 assure us that the intention of Jesus is to lead us there. Allow our lives to be lifted by the thought**

**that the Risen Christ is with us to lead us to the fullness of life. Be looking for the “green pastures”**

**of experiences that nourish us of God’s Spirit, filling us with love and joy**

**of scenes of “still waters” of the quiet calm of God’s grace-filled presence,**

**of our “restored life” new and fresh every morning because Jesus is alive, and he walks with us and talks with us and leads us on the right paths.**

**This is a great life: all that Psalm 23 puts before us as a hope is given to us as a blessing by the resurrection of Jesus: The Good Shepherd is present for us:**

**Surely goodness and mercy will follow us all the days of our lives, and we shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever. Amen.**


